

#### Hello Barb;

Fortunately on Christmas we only had one patient who happened to be an infant. The nurses chose the luvee(pacifier attached to stuffed animal) and the baby book for this patient. The special story is that at the end of the month we had a patient admitted with a serious diagnosis that had to be shipped out the same night. It was very emotional for the whole family including the staff. I had a note on my desk the next moment telling me about it. The Nurse explained that she had given the patient a Lego set and then they got talking about Star Wars. The Patient had wanted a Baby Yoda for Christmas but didn't get one. The Nurse went back to my office and came back with the Baby Yoda and presented it. This gift that you picked out gave a little reprieve from the new diagnosis and the long Journey ahead. It brought Joy for the nurse to be able to give it and happiness to the patient. Baby Yoda had his first ambulance ride and the patient had someone to take it with him. I just wanted to let you know that you gave more than toys. WE continue to hand out the other gifts as appropriate. Thank you so much for all that you do and It was so wonderful to see you this Christmas. It was both short and sweet. May the new year bring you good health, safety and a better work climate.


